Lyon Township Storm Water Master Plan: Approach

- A. Analysis of existing drainage system
- B. Develop and evaluate storm water management approaches
- C. Develop a plan for implementing the Storm Water Master Plan

Existing Conditions: Summary of Findings Existing Drainage System

- The existing drainage system is functioning quite well
 - Storm water modeling shows few structures within the 100 year floodplain
 - Review of records and interviews with Township officials revealed few serious problems

Existing Conditions: Flood Hazard Maps

- Compliance with FEMA Flood Insurance Program

Existing Conditions: Drain Inspection

- Regular inspection and maintenance of drains is recommended
 - County Inspections
 - Township Inspections

Existing Conditions: Existing Drainage Problems

- Intersections of Milford, Grand River and Pontiac Trail
 - Local flooding problem
 - Sewer to New Hudson Drain will help
- Vicinity of Brainer's Greenhouse
 - Fill has been placed north of the property
 - Drainage may not be engineered properly
 - Current site plan should be carefully reviewed
- Novi-Lyon Drain/Haas Lake Park
 - Undersized culverts
 - Walnut Hills Golf Course
 - Blackwood Drain
- Lyon Meadows
 - Potential Problem
 - Walkouts should be surveyed
- Orchards of Lyon
 - Detention Basin
 - 100 Year Overflow
 - Vet Clinic
 - Redesigned Basin
- Lyon Trails
 - Backyard Flooding

- Downstream Wetlands
- 50' Setback now required
- Lyon Industrial
 - Retention Basin infiltration problem
 - Association Problem
 - Chapter 18 Drain
- Griswold/10 Mile
 - Church and Funeral Home
 - Natural Low Area
 - No 100 year overflow

Storm Water Management Strategies “Do Nothing” Approach

- This strategy would result in increased flooding and then expensive drain enlargements
 - Future Land Use Maps
 - Development increases the runoff

Storm Water Management Strategies Improvements of Existing County Drains

Storm Water Management Strategies Regional Detention Basins

Storm Water Management Strategies On-Site Detention and Retention Basins

- Change allowable discharge rate of 0.1 cfs per acre for a 100 year storm
- Consider Chapter 18 drains for maintenance of on-site drainage systems

Storm Water Management Strategies Regulation of 100 Year Floodplain

Storm Water Management Strategies Storm Water Quality

- Continue the use of on-site storm water management basins
- Preserve natural features adjacent to county drains
- Soil erosion and sedimentation control
- Storm Water Pollution Prevention Initiatives

Lyon Township Storm Water Master Plan Implementation Plan

- A. Resolve existing drainage problems
- B. Flood Control Ordinance
- C. Enforcement of Existing Regulations
- D. Revise Engineering Design Standards
- E. Consult with a Michigan Department of Environment Quality
- F. Consider establishing Chapter 18 Drains
- G. Inspection of County Drains
- H. Storm Water Quality Issues
 - Continued use of storm water management basins
 - Maintain the existing natural features within and adjacent to county drains
 - Soil erosion and sedimentation control
 - Storm Water Pollution Prevention Initiatives
- I. Planning Issues
 - Detention/Retention Basins

- Public uses adjacent to county drains
