Summer taxes are due on Wednesday, September 14, 2016. After this date, you will be subject to interest and penalties.

Checks should be made payable to Patricia D. Carcone, Treasurer. Payment can be mailed or brought to the Township Hall at 58000 Grand River, New Hudson, MI 48165. If you wish to deliver payment while the Township Hall is closed, there is a drop box located on the circular drive in front of the building.

# Fall Fire Safety Tips

Fall is the time to fire up the fireplaces, turn on the furnace, and get that space heater out of storage. This can increase the risk of residential fire, so follow the safety tips below when heating your home during the cooler months. Also, please note that the Lyon Township Fire Department will conduct a <u>FREE</u> home fire safety inspection, at the request of the homeowner. #### **Fireplaces**

- Keep your damper open if there are hot ashes in your fireplace. Closing the damper could enable hot ashes to heat up and cause a damaging fire.
- Don't let creosote build up in your chimney, as it could set off a roof fire.
- Don't "over build" your fire using too much paper. You could ignite the soot in your chimney.
- Never burn charcoal in your fireplace. It gives off deadly carbon monoxide.
- Inspect your chimney regularly for cracks and obstructions
- Let ashes cool in a sealed metal container.

#### **Furnaces**

- Before you turn on your furnace, have it inspected by a qualified professional.
- Make sure to check the condition of the automatic controls and emergency shutoffs.
- If the walls and ceilings around your furnace feel too hot, add insulation or additional clearance space.
- Keep all trash and combustibles away from the furnace.
- Check your chimney for cracks or loose bricks.
- Seal all unused flue openings with solid masonry.

#### **Space Heaters**

- Make sure your space heater has a working safety light, alarm, automatic shutoff switch, & cutoff device to prevent overheating.
- Keep all objects, people, and pets at least three feet away from the heater.
- Never use a space heater in your bathroom. Water and electric appliances don't mix.


#### **Michigan Activity Pass**

It's Back to School time! I hope everyone has had a fun and relaxing summer. With my youngest daughter packing up to leave for college, we are looking forward to a very busy fall in anticipation of the November Presidential Election. Our August 2<sup>nd</sup> Primary Election went very smoothly, with Lyon Township reporting a 29.09% voter turn-out. We are anticipating mailing all of the absentee ballots that we received signed applications for on Wednesday, October 5, 2016. If you returned your application and don't get your ballot by October 13<sup>th</sup>, please call the Clerk's Office at 248-437-2240 so we can check.

We are in need of Election Workers for the November 8, 2016 General Election. The requirements to work in the elections in Lyon Township are; you must be a U.S. Citizen, registered voter in the State of Michigan, or 16 years of age; and you must attend a new election inspector training comping up in mid-October 2016 (dates to be announced). If you are able to attend a training or have a certificate from another community you can show me, please fill out the Lyon Township Precinct Election Inspector application and email it to <a href="mailto:mcash@lyontwp.org">mcash@lyontwp.org</a> or drop it off at the Township Hall.

If you are a new resident, please check to make sure that you are registered to vote in the Township at your new address prior to the election. Otherwise, on Election Day, you will have to vote at your old precinct. Any college students that are going away to school need to apply for an absentee ballot if they have voted in their precinct at least one time. If they have not voted before, they need to come see us with their valid picture ID and apply for an absentee ballot. Any questions, please feel free to contact the Clerk's Office at 248-437-2240.
